



Bridging Plan for Next Scouting Year

- In building a council business plan for 2022-23, we wanted to be laser-focused on our colonies, especially where
 - We have a waitlist of more than 5 youth
 - There are 8-16 youth but less than 3 scouters

Background Info

- 2022 Scouting year gives us much to celebrate:
 - 58% growth in membership vs 2021 (highest nationally except for Quebec). In comparison, our growth pre-Covid was 2% (and that was highest nationally, too)
 - 71% retention
 - 65 new volunteers



We Know Scouters Are Concerned About...

Space needs especially for cold weather months- adequate indoor meeting space to allow for physical distancing.

Greater influx of brand-new scouters meaning more mentorship is required in many colonies; scouter burn-out occurring where one or two returning scouters carry along most of the planning and facilitation.

Capacity limits based on cohorting as set forth in our Pandemic Standards (Stages 2-3); needing to balance scouter attendance with patrol numbers (i.e. a minimum of 4 scouters and 16 youth).

Background Info: What Did We Consider? Waitlist for colony makes up 64 % of the total waitlist for council and is equivalent to 26% of our colony membership

Sections with more than 5 waitlisted youth are exclusive to colony (9 sections)

We have 142 youth who want to be Beavers

65 new scouters joined us this year, and 33 joined our colonies. Let's give our new scouters what they need to be confident and continue to run fantastic program and reduce the potential for scouter burnout.

We have sections running with less than 3 scouters on paper but 8-16 youth – let's shore them up with 2-3 more scouters.

Safety Leadership – In Summary

For MAAF: The Scouter-in-Charge must complete a MAAF for all activities away from the usual meeting place. This includes Category 1 outdoor activities. MAAF needs to be approved by GC before the activity (Needs to allow for sufficient review time)

For ERP: All Scouting in-person activities (indoor and outdoor) will follow the requirements detailed in the Adventure Standards and Emergency Management Standards. ERP is more of an "overall" planning document not specific to an activity - but should be reviewed and updated seasonally


