

Follow Long Rd to Sunken Lake Rd

- ↑ 1. Head northeast on Long Rd toward Long Rd Bridge 43 s (350 m)
- ↶ 2. Turn left onto Long Rd Bridge 300 m
- ↶ 3. Turn left onto Sunken Lake Rd 24 m
- ↶ 4. Turn left onto Deep Hollow Rd 3 min (2.7 km)
- ↶ 4. Turn left onto Deep Hollow Rd 6 min (5.1 km)
- ↷ 5. Turn right onto White Rock Rd 10 s (96 m)
- ↶ 6. Turn left onto Ridge Rd 3 min (2.5 km)

Take NS-101 W and Evangeline Trail/Nova Scotia Trunk 1 W to Exhibition St in Kentville

- ↶ 7. Turn left onto Greenwich Rd S 12 min (11.9 km)
- ↶ 8. Turn left onto the Nova Scotia 101 W ramp to Middleton/Yarmouth 1.0 km
- ↶ 9. Merge onto NS-101 W 400 m
- ↷ 10. Take exit 12 toward Nova Scotia 1 Trunk/Trans-Canada Highway/New Minas/Kentville 5.4 km
- ↷ 11. Turn right onto New Minas Connector Rd 350 m
- ↶ 12. Turn left onto Evangeline Trail/Nova Scotia Trunk 1 W 1.5 km
- ↑ 13. Continue onto Cornwallis St/NS-341 E/NS-359 N (signs for Nova Scotia 359) 2.5 km
- ↑ 13. Continue onto Cornwallis St/NS-341 E/NS-359 N (signs for Nova Scotia 359) 700 m
- ↶ 14. Turn left onto Exhibition St 44 s (450 m)

It starts with Scouts.

Evacuation plan: Sunken Lake Scout Camp

If smelling smoke or seeing or suspecting fire or a smoke detector activates in ANY building *immediately and loudly shout “Fire!”*

- Everyone will immediately leave *every* building on site
- Call 911 via cell phone to report the emergency
- Everyone will immediately meet at the muster point – the fire pit by the wharf
- Make a head count and account for everyone

If a full camp evacuation is needed

- Complete head count at muster point
- Everyone will walk or travel by vehicle out the camp driveway
- Muster at the entrance rope gate for an additional head count
- Await further instruction from emergency responders.

If the camp driveway is blocked

- Walk as a group up the mowed grass path next to the camp parking area to the Long family private driveway,
- Turn right, walk to the paved road, turn right again
- Muster at the camp entrance rope gate for a head count and await further instruction from emergency responders

In the event of any emergency; i.e., intruder, animal, injury, fire, etc:

- Call 911 immediately
- Inform the call taker that you are calling from:
Sunken Lake Scout Camp, 81 Long Rd., Kings County, NS.
- The nearest community is New Minas
- The camp is in the Kings RCMP jurisdiction
- The camp is in the Greenwich Fire Department jurisdiction

Extinguishers are stored in the main lodge. An extinguisher must be in all occupied cabins at all times. Return the extinguisher to storage in the main lodge upon departure.

Sunken Lake Camp - Additional Policies and Plans

Forest Fire Prevention Plan

- Renters must follow all provincial forest fire prevention policies. In particular, campfires are only permitted when indicated by the Nova Scotia Burning Restrictions website, at <http://novascotia.ca/natr/forestprotection/wildfire/burnsafe/>
- Campfires must be in the fire pit between the lodge and the lake.
- In the event of a forest fire on the property or nearby, call 911 and follow the Camp's fire evacuation plan (posted in all buildings)

Crisis Response Plan

- Renters of the camp are expected to:
 - Bring their own first aid supplies
 - Ensure that individuals with appropriate first aid training are available
 - Be responsible for appropriate supervision of water activities, including canoeing and swimming. The camp provides PFDs, bailers and throw ropes for canoes.
- All renters are to appoint 1 fire marshall for every 5 persons on site to a maximum of 3 fire marshalls. Fire Marshals shall be responsible for identifying and addressing any life safety concerns, and fire hazards. In the event of a fire be responsible for accounting for all persons on site by conducting a roll call at the muster point. The fire marshals shall also decide if a complete evacuation of the camp is necessary and conduct the evacuation as per the posted evacuation plan.
- In the event of a medical emergency, fire, or other crisis, call 911 and provide the camp address (81 Long Road, Sunken Lake) which is posted in the lodge. Directions to the nearest hospital and other emergency information is posted in the lodge.

Nature and Environmental Policy

- Renters must remove all recyclables, compost and garbage from camp on departure. These may be placed in the green shed near the camp entrance on Sunken Lake Rd.
- Campers should follow the "Leave No Trace" camping. From the Scouts Canada website, *No-trace or "minimum impact" camping, is Scouting's outdoor philosophy. Leaders and youth in all sections must learn and teach each other minimum impact outdoor skills, so that the natural world will be there for us to enjoy for many years to come.*

Here are some more ideas to practise Leave No Trace ethics:

- *Pack out all garbage, and pick up garbage left behind by other campers*
- *Take only pictures*
- *Hike along existing trails whenever possible*
- *Don't wash dishes (or bathe) directly in lakes, rivers, streams or ponds*
- *Don't feed or harass wildlife*
- *Respect the rights of fellow campers - keep voices low and leave radios at home*
- *Don't cut down living plants or trees*
- *Don't dig trenches around tents, and don't dig holes for grease pits*
