## OFFERS OF SERVICE (OOS)

### Scouts, Venturers, Rovers & Scouters!

Need a Leadership Adventure/Challenge for your personal Canadian Path Progression? Coming to camp as an OOS is an incredible experience. You help to run the camp! We arrive a day before the cubs, we camp together and eat together. We are looking to fill the following teams:

- ▶ Program Team - setup, lead/co-lead activities, take-down - must be in camp by 7:00pm on the Thursday (Jun 1 or Jun 8) to help prepare/practice activities
- ▶ Activity Leaders - travel with Cubs to each activity/session & help them participate
- ▶ 1st Aid Team - provide 1st aid as necessary, must be St. John's or Red Cross certified a minimum of Standard 1st Aid, CPR Level A
- ▶ Administration Team - dot the i's & cross the t's - collect/manage any missing paperwork/fees, etc; Some need to arrive early.
- ▶ Reception/Ambassador Team - greet groups as they arrive, show them to their sites, & help them find their way around camp throughout the weekend. Must arrive prior to 12:00pm on first day (Jun 2 or Jun 9)
- ▶ Kitchen Team - provide all meals to OOS, prepare, cook, clean, repeat! Provide camp wide lunch to all! Everyone's favourite people!
- ▶ Support Team - Gophers/Runners for the other teams - take them food, supplies for program, messages and whatever else is needed. Should arrive early (Thurs night or early Fri)

Meals included/provided. Plan to eat in staff area for updates/meetings

OOS Camp Site: We have our own staff site. We will visit during downtimes, have our own campfire rings, etc.

Scout/Venturer ONLY Activity - during the wide game for the Cubs, that the SK Service Corps supervises, we want to have an activity/game for the Youth OOS - we are looking for suggestions.

**Arrival:** An advantage to OOS is an extra day to play! **Please try to arrive on Thursday evening, June 1 or 8** to get settled in. We will start to set up camp and we appreciate all the help we can get. Many hands make light work - and it's nice to relax and visit before all the participants arrive. Some groups send their scout troops/venturers separate from their cub packs so they can arrive early.

# SK Cub Cuboree '23 - Registration Instructions

We are very excited to be putting together a SK Cuboree this year! Scout Troops & Venturer Companies will be putting on this event for Cub Packs (White Tail Beavers are welcome as a “linking opportunity”). This event is open to both registered & non-registered youth. An excellent opportunity for recruitment if you have the capacity / ratio in your section.

Different this year is that we are hosting this event twice — at Good Spirit Scout Camp (Jun 2-4) and at Anglin Lake Scout Camp (Jun 9-11). This decision was made based on feedback given by the cub packs who attended the last three provincial cub packs. Travelling long distances with cubs is difficult.

Scout Troops & Venturer Companies will be planning the activities together and different teams will run each camp. The bonus is that it gives you two date options, as well as location options — choose what works best for your group!

This is short notice this year — but we wanted to get it going again. We are using the same template as previous years, and have people involved in the planning at each location who are familiar with the provincial cub camp and the locations, to help ensure our success.

We need your help in ensuring this event is a success — so please do the following to help us process the information quickly.

- **ASAP** - Send us a quick email — [skcubcamp@gmail.com](mailto:skcubcamp@gmail.com) to let us know which camp you are interested in coming to — even if you have already told someone. We will then reply with a “Welcome Letter” that gives you extra details for that particular location.
- Look at the registration package early — it is available on the [SK Council website](#), as well as on ScoutsTracker. There are two registration packages — one for Participants (Cub Packs) and one for Offer of Service or OOS (Scouts & Venturers). The website will be the main source of information for this event.
- Scoutstracker — If your section uses this then you can also find the event by clicking on “Schedule” and under options choosing to be able to see Council events. You can then “subscribe” to the event. As updates are made to the event details you will see them. We will use the “Council News” to draw your attention to any important changes.
- Parents / Guardians — all non-registered adults will need to complete the full screening requirements for parent helpers, including a PRC and Safe Scouting for parents training. This is because everyone at this event will be helping in some capacity. If you have any questions about this, please call Lana Abrahamson 306-441-5262.
- Start gathering your information early. You need to send in member detail information (health info) with your package — so if you are a new Scouter, and are unsure where to find these things, please contact us and we will help you.

# SK Cub Camp '23 - Personal OOS Pack List

We may have to hike in our gear from the unload area, so keep that in mind as you are packing.

Parents of Scouts/Venturers - ticks are an issue at Good Spirit. Long pants / long socks will help. At Anglin Lake ticks have not been an issue to date.

## Small Backpack/Daypack:

- Water bottle(s) (filled with water!)
- Rain coat/poncho
- Bug Spray



## Bring:

- Hat
- Uniform shirt and necker/woggle (if you wear it to travel, you're sure to have it)
- 2 Sweaters/Sweatshirt/Hoodie
- Warm jacket
- Running shoes/hiking boots
- T-shirts/Long sleeve shirts (3-4, but at least 1 long sleeve)
- Pants (1-2) - Shorts are not recommended
- Undergarments (3-4)
- Socks (4-5) (1 pair wool if possible)
- Pajamas (or other modest sleeping gear)
- Sleeping bag
- Camp mat (thin foam, or therma-rest type) -no air mattresses
- Camp Pillow or pillow case
- Mess kit (plastic or metal dish set in a mesh bag: plate, bowl, cup, knife, fork, spoon) - Dishes must be able to hang on a line & drip dry. Check Online Scout Shop or Dollar Store for mesh bags.
- Toothbrush, toothpaste (toiletries) - **in a labeled ziploc bag** (these are stored away from the sleeping area so it is very important that they are labelled)
- Hairbrush / elastics (if applicable)
- Small plastic garbage bags (2-3 for dirty/wet gear)
- Rain boots (just in case) or extra shoes
- Camp Chair
- Flashlight with batteries
- Tent - you will need a tent to sleep in. If you are coming as a troop/company then bring enough tents for your group. If you are coming as an individual, please note in the comments if you have a tent you can bring, and the size. We will group lone youth with others if they'd like. If you want to tent solo - you need to bring a small solo tent as space is limited.

## DO NOT BRING:

- X Food - of any kind. All food must be brought by scouters/group and stored correctly, **NO EXCEPTIONS!** If there are medical conditions, please ensure that your myscouts registration info is up to date and your scouters are aware. Dietary issues will be taken from that information
- X Electronics - no gaming devices. Cell service is available. Cell phones for youth are not generally recommended at camp. There is no ability to charge them or keep them dry. They are a main communication device at camp - so use your judgement and bring a battery power pack

## Optional:

- Camp blanket
- Extra batteries for flashlight
- Theme attire ("Mario") - be appropriate
- Small camera
