SK Cub Cuboree '23 - Registration Instructions

We are very excited to be putting together a SK Cuboree this year! Scout Troops & Venturer Companies will be putting on this event for Cub Packs (White Tail Beavers are welcome as a "linking opportunity"). This event is open to both registered & non-registered youth. An excellent opportunity for recruitment if you have the capacity / ratio in your section.

Different this year is that we are hosting this event twice — at Good Spirit Scout Camp (Jun 2-4) and at Anglin Lake Scout Camp (Jun 9-11). This decision was made based on feedback given by the cub packs who attended the last three provincial cub packs. Travelling long distances with cubs is difficult.

Scout Troops & Venturer Companies will be planning the activities together and different teams will run each camp. The bonus is that it gives you two date options, as well as location options — choose what works best for your group!

This is short notice this year — but we wanted to get it going again. We are using the same template as previous years, and have people involved in the planning at each location who are familiar with the provincial cub camp and the locations, to help ensure our success.

We need your help in ensuring this event is a success — so please do the following to help us process the information quickly.

- ASAP Send us a quick email skcubcamp@gmail.com to let us know which camp you are interested in coming to even if you have already told someone. We will then reply with a "Welcome Letter" that gives you extra details for that particular location.
- Look at the registration package early it is available on the <u>SK Council website</u>, as well as on ScoutsTracker. There are two registration packages — one for Participants (Cub Packs) and one for Offer of Service or OOS (Scouts & Venturers). The website will be the main source of information for this event.
- Scoutstracker If your section uses this
 then you can also find the event by
 clicking on "Schedule" and under options
 choosing to be able to see Council events.
 You can then "subscribe" to the event. As
 updates are made to the event details you

- will see them. We will use the "Council News" to draw your attention to any important changes.
- Parents / Guardians all non-registered adults will need to complete the full screening requirements for parent helpers, including a PRC and Safe Scouting for parents training. This is because everyone at this event will be helping in some capacity. If you have any questions about this, please call Lana Abrahamson 306-441-5262.
- Start gathering your information early.
 You need to send in member detail information (health info) with your package so if you are a new Scouter, and are unsure where to find these things, please contact us and we will help you.

CUBS: Please be sure that YOU are packing your gear! You need to know what you have brought and where it is packed. You can have an adult help you, but they should not pack for you. Items should be packed in a duffel bag or camping backpack. We may have to hike in our gear from the unload area, so keep that in mind as you are packing.

Hint: if you pack all your clothes and sleeping bag into big garbage bags inside your pack, then all your gear will stay dry - even if it is raining:

- X Food of any kind. All food must be brought by scouters/ group and stored correctly, NO EXCEPTIONS! If there are medical conditions, please ensure that your myscouts registration info is up to date and your scouters are aware. Dietary issues will be taken from that information
- X Electronics there is no ability to charge them or keep them dry.
