

# Council Voting Representatives Nomination time is here!

Would you like to be a Council Voting Representative at Scouts Canada's Annual General Meeting? Or do you know someone who you would like to nominate? Nominations are open April 16 to May 14, 2024.

Scouts Canada is a corporation created by an Act of Parliament and as required, holds an Annual General Meeting (AGM). There are specific statutory requirements for an AGM including approval of financial statements, appointment of public accountants for the next year's audit and election of Officers and Directors. To ensure fair and open representation of our membership at the AGM and any special meetings, three Voting Representatives are elected annually to represent each Council.

One of the three Voting Representative positions is reserved for a youth member, but it should be noted that all three Voting Representatives from a Council may be youth members. All members under the age of 27 years on September 1, 2024 are defined as youth.

This year's Annual General Meeting is planned to be held in **November 2024**.

- Fostering an atmosphere of fun and create those cherished (at camp) memories for everyone.


## **Qualifications:**

# Say YES to More Youth - Lodges and Lairs Grant

Does your group have a plan to increase capacity for Beavers and Cubs? Submit your plan to the Network to receive funding.

This is a Scouter led initiative, and we ask that the person submitting on behalf of the group be a member on the Network. Please do work with your Relationship Manager/Group Support Scouter who can assist you with creating and provide support with implementing your plans.

Grants are offered Grizzly Den-style: make an ask, and we will grant as best we can. AND: plans already sort of drafted, on the back of a napkin, but not in place - or only partially in place - are welcome! (example: you want to open new pack, need 3 volunteers, only have 1 so far. Use the grant to help recruit more folks).

Info sessions are being offered and will cover grant submission key dates.
