

PJ Travel

Are you ready to kick off the summer by attending the Pacific Jamboree? We're excited that 2,500 participants and 800 volunteers want to join our adventure at Camp Barnard July 6th to 13th.

In an effort to have everyone arrive in one piece, the PJ team needs to know your travel plans. Many groups have registered for bus transfer from Victoria Airport, ferry and bus transfer from Tsawwassen Mills (Vancouver), or free drop off near camp. Due to development around Sooke, private vehicle parking is *extremely* limited. They estimate there will only be space for 100 vehicles and nearly half of these spaces are already sold.

Tsawwassen Mills (Vancouver) to Camp Barnard by Ferry

- Meet at Tsawwassen Mills Mall and transfer your camping gear into camp cargo trucks. Take a short bus ride to the BC Ferries terminal and enjoy the 90 min ferry to Vancouver Island. A bus will be waiting in Swartz Bay to take you to camp. Your camping gear will arrive at camp at the same time.
- Please limit camping gear to 50 lbs so youth can lift and carry.
- No flammable liquids or propane is permitted in the cargo trucks.

Victoria Airport to Camp Barnard

 After you book your flight, please book your bus transfer to Camp Barnard. Collect your bags at Victoria International Airport and exit the terminal. Your scheduled bus will be waiting outside of Arrivals.

Please visit the PJ Transportation <u>booking site</u> to reserve your Airport or Ferry Bus Transfers. Private transfers are available on request. The PJ Transportation team will do their best to get everyone to camp stress free.

- Fostering an atmosphere of fun and create those cherished (at camp) memories for everyone.



Does your group have a plan to increase capacity for Beavers and Cubs? Submit your plan to the Network to receive funding.

This is a Scouter led initiative, and we ask that the person submitting on behalf of the group be a member on the Network. Please do work with your Relationship Manager/Group Support Scouter who can assist you with creating and provide support with implementing your plans.

Grants are offered Grizzly Den-style: make an ask, and we will grant as best we can. AND: plans already sort of drafted, on the back of a napkin, but not in place - or only partially in place - are welcome! (example: you want to open new pack, need 3 volunteers, only have 1 so far. Use the grant to help recruit more folks).

Info sessions are being offered and will cover grant submission key dates.
